

Allergies/Illness:

- Please inform school of any allergies your child has. As we have children in school with severe nut allergies we ask that any kind of nuts are not brought to school.
- If your child is unwell and unable to come to school please inform the office as early as possible.

Going Home:

Starting in Foundation 1

Starting school is a significant milestone in your child's life. We will do all we can to help them feel welcome, safe and secure. We are aware of the tremendous input that you, as parents, have already made in the education of your child and we look forward to developing a partnership with you in these valuable early years.

Preparing Your Child

Before starting talk to your child about where they are coming and about the things they will be doing and the people they will be meeting. It is important to remember that young children vary tremendously in the way in which they react to new experiences so do allow your child plenty of time to settle in - some children may take longer to settle than others.



Independence:

- Independence is encouraged from the very first day in Foundation 1.
- Each child self registers every day by collecting their name card and placing it in a basket.
- Time is spent with all children teaching them the procedures for all of the different activities and routines.
- The children are encouraged to choose their own activities at various times throughout the session.

Helping at home

- Reading together is an excellent way to help your child. Ask your child questions about the story and the pictures as you go along.
- Singing songs and rhymes together. Encourage your child to join in with the actions and the counting.
- Talk to your child about the things that they do and the things that they can see. Count things together, point out numbers in the environment, look at different colours and shapes.
- Encourage your child to make marks and scribbles on paper. Give lots of praise for all marks. Talk to your child about the marks they have made.

The Early Years Foundation Stage is based upon four principles:

A Unique Child

All children are unique and all develop at different rates, but we believe that all children who have positive attitudes will be resilient, capable and confident learners.

Positive Relationships

Strong relationships help children to be strong and independent. We will develop caring relationships with the children and families.

Enabling Environments

We recognise that the environment plays a key role in supporting children's learning and development. The environment is designed to allow the children to explore and learn safely and supports the children to become independent learners.
